**Before you invest in any fund, consider how the fund would work with your other investments and your tolerance for risk.**

As of September 27, 2019, TDAM has received unitholder approval to amend the investment objectives of the fund.

Effective November 7, 2019, the fund's benchmark index will change as described below under "What does the fund invest in?". In addition, TDAM will reduce the management fee for e-Series of the fund from 0.30% to 0.25%.

## What does the fund invest in?

The fund invests mainly in stocks that are included in the S&P/TSX Composite Total Return Index ("S&P/TSX Composite Index"). This index is made up of Canadian stocks that trade on the Toronto Stock Exchange. Up to 30% of the fund may be invested in foreign stocks.

**Effective November 7, 2019, the above paragraph should be read as:**

The fund invests mainly in stocks in substantially the same proportion as its benchmark index, either directly or indirectly through other investment funds (specifically, the TD Canadian Equity Index ETF). The fund's benchmark is Solactive Canada Broad Market Index (CA NTR), an index calculated by Solactive AG, which tracks the Canadian stock market. Up to 30% of the fund may be invested in foreign stocks.

The charts below give you a snapshot of the fund's investments on August 31, 2019. The fund's investments will change.



**How risky is it?**

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

**Risk rating**

TDAM has rated the volatility of this fund as **medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

**How has the fund performed?**

This section tells you how e-Series securities of the fund performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

**Year-by-year returns**

This chart shows how e-Series securities of the fund performed in each of the past 10 completed calendar years. The fund dropped in value in 3 of the 10 years.

The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.

**Best and worst 3-month returns**

This table shows the best and worst returns for e-Series securities of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

**Average return**

As of August 31, 2019, the annual compounded return of e-Series securities of the fund was 7.0% over the past 10 years. If you had invested \$1,000 in e-Series securities of the fund 10 years ago, your investment would now be worth \$1,970.

**Who is this fund for?**

This fund may be suitable for investors who:

- are investing for the medium to long-term
- want to track the returns of a major Canadian equity index
- are contributing to the growth component of a diversified portfolio
- can handle the ups and downs of the stock market

This fund may not be suitable for investors seeking a steady source of income.

**A word about tax**

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay and/or when you pay depends on the tax laws where you live, the type of distributions made by the fund and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, you must include taxable fund distributions in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

**How much does it cost?**

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell e-Series securities of the fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

**1 Sales charges**

This series is available on a "no-load" basis which means that you do not pay a sales charge when you buy this series.

**2 Fund expenses**

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

As of June 30, 2019, the fund's expenses were 0.33% of its average value. This equals \$3.30 for every \$1,000 invested.

**Annual rate (as a % of the fund's value)**

**Management expense ratio (MER)**

This is the total of the fund's management fee (which includes the trailing commission) and any expenses, costs or fees incurred by the fund which are not paid for by the manager.

**More about the trailing commission**

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

TDAM pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm, including a discount broker. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate is 0.00% to 0.25% of the value of your investment each year. This equals \$0.00 to \$2.50 each year for every \$1,000 invested.

**3 Other fees**

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund.

Other fees	What you pay
Short-term trading fee	Up to 2% of the purchase cost of the securities if you redeem them or switch them to another fund within 30 days of purchasing them. This fee goes to the fund.
Switch fee	Your representative's firm may charge you up to 2% of the value of securities you switch to another fund.

**What if I change my mind?**

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or fund facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of your purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, fund facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
